OPLC Speaker August 12, 2023– Chris Osterman Mining in Saudi Arabia



We are in for a very unique treat for our August 12, 2023 OPLC monthly meeting. Our very own distinguished member, Dr. Chris Osterman will share with us his recent mining expedition in Saudi Arabia. He has talked to us before about the discovery of the Silver Boulders in Gila County, Leopard opal from Mexico, and Mongolian turquoise from Kazakhstan. He has been a very busy man travelling to Romania, Portugal and Saudi Arabia for mining explorations.

Chris shared that, "The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is home to one of the oldest cultures in the world, and very likely the location of King Solomon's gold mines. The Kingdom has a history of trading. The national museum is full of 4000 year old jewelry. During the Roman Empire, the Arabian Peninsula was the source of much of the leather for the Roman legions. Now more known for the oil reserves, Saudi Arabia is a rapidly industrializing and urbanizing country with tremendous cash reserves. Most recently, the Kingdom has encouraged western mining companies to come in and start exploring for gold, copper, and nickel. Our talk will discuss the history of the Kingdom, gold mining, some of the early jewelry, the geography of the country, the people, and the exploration for nickel in the mountains to the east of the Red Sea."

Chris Osterman has been involved with gold, silver and copper mining for the last 35 years. After earning a Ph.D. in Geology at the Colorado School of Mines, Chris has lived and worked in southern Africa, North and South America, and Central Asia. He served as the Chief Executive Officer of First Mining Finance Corporation, a company dedicated to the exploration of gold and silver deposits throughout the Americas, and is currently President of the Phoenix Silver Corporation, which holds the silver boulders and property.


