February 14, 2026, OPLC speaker – Bernie Emery, G.G.
Gemstone Grading Introduction



We are in for another great treat for our February 14, 2026 OPLC monthly meeting with a new speaker, Bernie Emery, coming all the way from Maryland, who will present **Gemstone Grading Introduction**. Bernie Emery is a Graduate Gemologist, G.G. certified by the GIA, and will be sharing his knowledge on how to evaluate our gemstones. He uses that knowledge to understand the nature of gemstones he facets, cabs or carves. Bernie shared, “we will take an adventure through the 4C’s of colored gemstones — **Color, Cut, Clarity and Carat Weight**.” He will explain the use of different grading systems and tools needed to establish values for colored gemstones.

Bernie has enjoyed our hobby for the past 50 years. He is a member of the Gem Cutters Guild of Baltimore, the Chesapeake Gem & Mineral Society, and the Baltimore Mineral Society. He has organized and been Show Chairman for their annual gem shows for the past 35 years! He is also a popular instructor at the annual EFMLS Wildacres Workshop in North Carolina, where he has taught basic and intermediate cabling for 15 years and is currently the faceting instructor. In 2018, Bernie was inducted into the Lapidary Hall of Fame for Excellence in Education.

It is Bernie Emery’s first time ever to Tucson for the gem shows. He will also be attending the Faceters Symposium here at OPLC.





Treasurer Report – Bruce Noble – Specific numbers cannot be published here but are available to members on request. OPLC begins 2026 with substantial assets. January cash flow was positive. A threefold increase in the past two water bills indicates a possible leak or loss by other means. The Tucson water utility will be contacted to determine the best course of action.

Membership – Jan Keisler – currently 265 for 2026 with more renewals and new memberships still to be processed.
