

**Fossils of El Golfo, Sonora, Mexico**

We are in for a special treat for our November 8, 2025, OPLC monthly meeting, with a new-for-us speaker, our very own member, Maureen “Mo” Garrett. She will be presenting us a talk about the Fossils of El Golfo, Mexico. The canyons and badlands in El Golfo, Sonora, Mexico – the upper Gulf of California - have been found full of land mammal and fauna fossils from the Irvingtonian Age and Calabrian stage of the Pleistocene Epoch.

Maureen “Mo” Garrett currently moved permanently to Tucson two years ago after living 32 years in Yuma, Arizona. While in Yuma she taught Jr. High Physical Education and Earth Science for 21 years. She then transferred to San Luis High School at the border and taught Earth Science to juniors and seniors for 9 years.

During those years in public education, she taught 20 years at Arizona Western College various geoscience courses. It was there that she became involved in numerous paleontological activities in Mexico, attending conferences and visiting various museums through the college. In the last three years she has traveled to Iceland, Costa Rica and Cuba on geology related “vacations”. She is currently taking advantage of OPLC’s silversmithing and cabling labs. 

We are in for a special treat for our October 11, 2025, OPLC monthly meeting with a new-for us speaker, author and photographer Gwendolyn Awen Jones. She will share her research on the **Callanish the Crown – the Stonehenge of the North** in Scotland.

“The Callanish stone circle is considered to be the real “Crown of Britain” says Gwendolyn. For millennia the Callanish stone circle was protected by deep layers of peat with only the tallest stones protruding above ground. In the 1800’s the thick peat layer was cut away to reveal the true magnificence of the stones.

Gwendolyn Awen Jones is a photographer and award-winning British author with a unique ability to see beyond the normal physical realms. She has spent years studying the ancient stone circles and ley lines in Britain. Gwendolyn was first drawn to the Callanish stones in 1986 where she witnessed a spectacular sunrise and full moonrise during the Summer Solstice. In 2016 she returned to complete a photographic record of the stones featured in her book **Callanish the Crown** of which she will bring copies at our meeting.
