


David Beatty: Rough slabs, polished slabs, bookend, petrified wood, rhyolite, crystals, specimens, opals, findings, cabs, obsidian, Brazilian agate and geodes/thunder eggs.

Bill McCormack: Books, magazines, tools, a motor, petrified wood, azurite, malachite, rhodocrosite, inlay slabs, slabs for cabbing, cabochons, UV light, optivisor, sandpaper, chrysoprase, cabs, clear quartz crystals and amethyst, turquoise, obsidian, jasper, agates, 6" grinding and polishing wheels, some faceting material, mother-of-pearl cabs, and purple rocks.

ART KAVAN



It is with great sadness to inform you of Art Kavan's passing on Saturday, November 26th. I have known Art for almost 16 years. Each newly retired, we first met in Harrison Yokum's Rock Hounding class. Discovering that our senses of humor were similar, we became "Bottom Feeders, just trying to get some fun out of life" and stayed friends. His wife, Sandy, and my wife, Rosemary, became friends as well. They liked to – let's just say it – gossip and plot ways to get their older offspring married off.



Prior to retiring, Art had done other things and had other careers. Among other careers, he was a corporate jet pilot and a fire chief. I got a kick out of one of his other pursuits: raising show chickens. He told Danny Harmsen about a show rooster costing over \$5,000. Danny thought that the rooster must have had great drumsticks. He had several other hobbies – all of which he did with focused zeal and amazing results. Art became interested in rock hounding. He prospected for a number of years and during this time, staked a claim for an opal mine. He became interested in the lapidary sciences shortly after starting to rock hound. This included gem cutting and polishing, as well as, cabochon fabricating, casting, and silversmith work. When he was past president of the OPLC, he started turning the Club around. Membership had been down to 20 some people. The Club membership was healthily growing when he coned me into the taking over the presidency.



Although Art remained active in all forms of lapidary, he had focused on gem stone faceting. Subsequently, he had won first place in United States and International faceting competitions several times at the Master's level. Art faceted stones for the Smithsonian and the Carnegie Institute. People were constantly buying his finished products and seeking him out to fabricate jewelry items or to cut special order gem stones for them.

Occasionally Art had tutored beginning faceters who had shown potential to become world class faceters. One of his students achieved first place in the recent world competition for Master faceters. A natural teacher, he had been committed to passing on his knowledge; especially, lapidary and mineral science. While president of the OPLC, Art established demonstration and information booths at the Pima County Fair and the Tucson Gem and Mineral Society's annual Tucson Gem and Mineral Show in the Tucson Convention Center. A couple of examples of his strong commitment to educate the community include the numerous trips to local schools at the requests of teachers for an overview of the mineral and lapidary worlds and presentations of selected lapidary topics to the members of the OPLC at monthly meetings.

He saw the need for a faceting machine to handle larger stones. Art and Robert W. Riley designed and built a faceting machine that can handle up to a 50 pound stone. Riley had gone on to build another machine to handle up to a seventy pound gem stone.

Art started the United States Faceting Guild (USFG) from scratch and served as its



president for five years. Recently, cancer had forced him to step down as president. The USFG's annual Hob Nob was started in 2001. However, it was Art Kavan who nurtured the Hobnob and developed it into the premier educational and social event for faceters. Each year in February during the Tucson Gem and Mineral Show, faceters from all over the globe get together to share their work, ideas, and solve mutual problems.

Art has truly enriched the world by being in it. He was charismatic force, not a spectator. I am very grateful for having the chance to meet him and be his friend. He has touched, influenced, and enriched the lives of countless other people who felt the same way. He was so very grateful to the many friends and relatives who kept in touch with calls, cards, letters and prayers. Thanks to all of his OPLC buddies, old neighbors, new neighbors, family, and lifelong friends. You have truly enriched his life. Honor his memory by spending time with family and friends.

KARTCHNER CAVERNS FIELD TRIP - JERRY GLAZMAN, TRIP COORDINATOR

The field trip to Kartchner Caverns is scheduled for Saturday, February 25, 2012. If we have at least 12 participants, the cost for OPLC members and their guests is \$18.96/tour. Regular tour price is \$22.95/tour. There will be 2 tours available, one for the Big Room (Maximum number = 17) and one for the Rotunda - Throne Room Complex (Maximum number = 20). The Big Room tour is scheduled for 10:15 am. The Rotunda - Throne Room Complex tour is scheduled for 2:00 pm. Either or both tours can be done. The tours are scheduled with enough time between so that both can be done the same day with sufficient time between for lunch in Benson. We are working to have Dr. Bob (our speaker at the April meeting) as our tour guide.

Each tour is about 1/2 mile of walking on paved trails with handrails for most of the distance. It's not a difficult walk since the trails are wheelchair and walker accessible. Temperature is around 70 F and 100% relative humidity year round.

The AZGS located at 416 Congress, contains over 15,000 books on the geology of Arizona. They have 86 linear feet of mine files taken over after the Department of Mines closed. His topic centered on the geology of the Catalina and Tucson mountain ranges.
