The meeting was chaired by Bill Penrose, in the absence of other executive members on vacation or working. A quorum of members was established.

Gregory McNamee delivered an updated talk on "Monumental Places: National Parks & Monuments in the Grand Canyon State".

Refreshments were supplied by Sandra Penrose, Alexandra Ramsey, and Rebecca Jones. Leia Ballard, who organizes the refreshments for the meeting, is in rehab for a recent surgery. We need a volunteer to bring in the food for next month's meeting. Members will be reimbursed up to \$40 for purchases.

Motion to approve last month's minutes, seconded and passed.

Financial report — Everyone involved in club finances is on vacation or working. There have been no large financial transactions in the past month, or upcoming, that need approval of the members. There is almost \$n in the checking and savings accounts and \$n in CDs. The club is in good health financially and we are on budget for the year so far.

Membership report (Janet Keisler). We have 382 members in good standing, but 4 of those still need to sign the liability form before they can use the labs.

New members and visitors introduced themselves.

Janelle is organizing a field trip to Alpine on June 3. By necessity, it's an overnight trip. Picture sandstone, petrified wood, and agates, also apache tears at Superior on the return trip.

Library – Bill Cascio indicated the library open for business.

Facebook Page for short and long term lab notices (Donovan Wagner) – The OPLC Monitor page on Facebook is named 'Old Pueblo Monitors'. ### June 2019 OPLC Speaker: Les Presmyk





We are in for another special treat for our June 8, 2019 OPLC monthly meeting. Les Presmyk is coming down from Phoenix to give us a presentation about the upcoming new UofA Gem & Mineral Museum in Tucson.

The University of Arizona Mineral Museum was established 100 years ago. About 3 years ago, Alan Norville brought the idea of building a museum complex downtown to include art, photography and minerals into one venue. This idea has since morphed into the partnership with Pima County to house the UofA Gem & Mineral Museum in the south half of the historic Pima County Courthouse.

Pima County has spent significant capital to bring the building up to modern standards and building codes. A project manager, the UofA museum staff and a dedicated group of volunteers are working diligently to program each of the exhibits in the three major halls of the museum. A visitor will start in the Mineral Evolution Hall, where the geologic and mineralogic history of the earth will be told. From here, the visitor will enter the Arizona and Mexico mineral and mining hall. Displays of Arizona and Mexican minerals will be here as well as telling the story of the rise of rockhounding in Arizona. Visitors will then move through the fluorescent mineral display where mineral specimens will be on display along with how fluorescence is used in gemstone identification. The third and final hall will contain the gems and precious metals displays.

Les Presmyk, along with his wife of almost 43 years, Paula, are Arizona natives and University of Arizona graduates. Following graduation, they both went to work in the mines, he as a mining engineer at the Magma Mine in Superior, Arizona and she as an assayer and chemist for the Miami Copper Company in Miami, Arizona. After the mines closed down, they moved to Mesa and then to Gilbert, where they have resided since 1986.

Les went into the coal side of the mining business, working for the Salt River Project in its Fuels Department, from which he retired two years ago. On the hobby side of his life, Les has collected minerals for 57 years. He is a member of the Mineralogical Society of Arizona, the Tucson Gem and Mineral Society (president), the Flagg Mineral Foundation (vice-chairman) and the Prescott Gem and Mineral Club. He has been on the Tucson Show Committee for over



The vacuum impregnation system is assembled and tested and ready for use. David and I tested it by painting activated Opticon on the surface of two different kinds of sample. When the chamber was pumped down, air was sucked out of the pores of the stone. This could be seen with a flashlight. Then air was let back into the chamber, forcing the Opticon into the pores. After three cycles of pumping until no more air came from the stone and the process was complete. Several monitors have been familiarized with the use of the chamber, and I have some instructions that will be posted next to it. Don't use the chamber without being checked out by a monitor who knows about it. In good time, we'll have a signup sheet plus a privilege list for people who've been checked out on the system.

Faceting Room (Dave Richardson) Classes underway and modifications made to the room to accommodate more people more comfortably.

Silent Auction (Dave Richardson)

Tim Henderson has donated a faceting machine plus a number of very fine stones and slab donation. Before putting these up for sale or for the silent auction, we intend to have the stones properly appraised so we don't sell the club short or charge too much.

Silver Lab (John Poole) Not much news. Everything is working.

Casting Room (Chuck Lundstrom). Regular sessions have been established. Jack D'Acquisto will be demonstrating or holding a class on broom casting.




