The treasurer Bob Powell gave the OPLC treasurers report and bank account status.

November 2018 OPLC Speaker  
Sindi Schloss- Symbolism in Global Jewelry



We are very fortunate to have another great speaker for our November 10, 2018 OPLC monthly meeting. Sindi Schloss, gemologist and jewelry appraiser, and President of the Metro Phoenix GIA Chapter, will be giving to us her newest presentation: **Symbolism in Global Jewelry**.

Jewelry is a huge component of global adornment, which along with body art and textiles are usually inspired by tribal beliefs. Jewelry often reflects symbols that were either observed in nature or assimilated from ancient cultures. Delving into symbols leads to a deeper understanding of modern jewelry design, as artists and jewelers reinterpret ancient motifs into new creations. In this presentation, Sindi will describe the key symbols, shared use of symbols and a geographic overview to help recognize and identify global jewelry motifs and sources. This fascinating presentation will inspire and create a deeper appreciation and awareness of the world around you and your use of symbols in crafted pieces.

Sindi Schloss, GIA GG, is owner and operator of her own firm, International Gemological Services, which provides jewelry appraisals, a gemstone testing laboratory and a school of gemology and the history of human adornment. As past chair of exhibitions of The Bead Museum in Arizona, she curated and installed many exhibitions on global jewelry and adornment.

Sindi will bring copies of her newly released, invaluable book *Beads: A Reference and Price Guide*, which has already been a great hit on the market.

So please do not miss this presentation!

David Richardson will be taking over for Tom McDevitt for the donations for the silent auction next year. He has already been helping out this year as well. My thanks go out to both Tom and David for their efforts as this is the biggest money maker that the club has every year. We are looking for a volunteer to help David with pick ups and sorting of material as it comes into the club. Please see Tom or David if you are interested in getting involved in this.

We will be ordering new wheels and saw blades for the cab lab this month to replace the worn out ones we currently have. This expenditure was already in the budget for this year. We should have them in by November.

As everyone has seen from the emails that Wayne has been sending out, the club training facility is currently closed due to a water leak in the main feed from our back flow valves to the main building. We had a plumber come out and locate the leaks at a cost of \$450 and apparently we have four different leaks in the galvanized pipes that were installed when the facility was first built. We are using about 38 gallons/hour with all the water in both buildings shut off (it's going into the ground). We have received four different bids from plumbing contractors to replace all of the pipes from the back flow valves to the main building and the training building, give us new shut off valves and replace and raise the hose bibs on both buildings. As we already have four leaks in the galvanized pipes to the main building we thought it prudent to replace all the main feed pipes to the facility. The cost estimates we received range from \$6000 to \$22,000. Your board had an emergency meeting this morning before this club meeting and have approved requesting the club to authorize a \$6,500 expenditure of club funds to repair the pipes and get the facility back up and running. The membership approved the expenditure of funds.

Bill Cascio added a new collar to the 20 ton press in the silver smithing lab that ensures that the pressure is evenly applied across the surface of the plates when pressure is applied. We have returned the 20 ton press we purchased from Harbor Freight as the reworked unit is working great! Thanks to Bill and I believe Billy Bob for their efforts in modifying this equipment.

The OPLC Tail Gate/parking lot sale will be held today AFTER the meeting.

The Faceting Frolic will be held again in 2019 during the GEM show. Set up for the event will be on Thursday 2/7/19 with the classes being held on Friday 2/8/19 and Saturday 2/9/19. The Hob Nob and associated faceting competition will be held on Saturday night on 2/9/19. We are looking for volunteers to help set up and run the Hob Nob event. Having helped a couple of times, I encourage folks to attend as we have world class faceters come to our club and its really interesting to see! If you are interested in helping out see Billy Bob or me after the meeting please.

Billy Bob has started up beginning faceting classes again on Tuesday's from 1-4. He has a sign up sheet for those that are interested. I believe we will also have an evening class session offered for faceting in the near future as well. Thanks to both Billy Bob and David Richardson for the classes and the maintenance of the faceting machines that they have both been working on.

Shane Thompson King has agreed to hold a second wire wrapping class starting sometime at the end of October or early November. I encourage everyone to take this if you are interested. I took it and he was a great instructor as he even managed to teach this old dog something! The cost for this class is \$20 and Shane will have a sign-up sheet on the board once he picks the dates. The classes will be held in this building.

The current lab times are posted on the bulletin board installed in the training building for us.

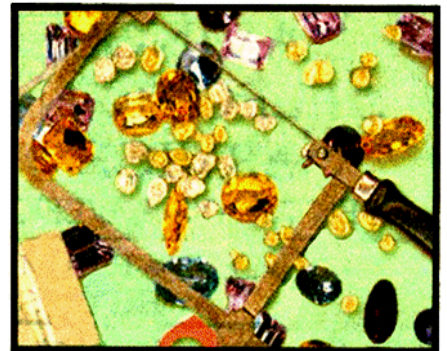

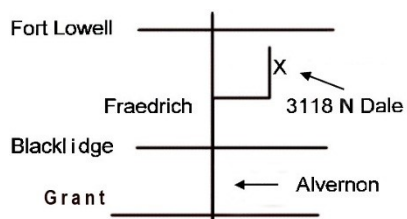
